God is working despite global challenges

God is continuing to advance His kingdom despite significant pandemic-related challenges. Here are some **testimonies** as well as **prayer requests** from dear friends of mine. To read more, visit this blog or holistic help for the nations.

- Pastor David in Masailand, northern Kenya is working to intercede on behalf of "young girls who are at heightened risk of forced child marriage and FGM"(a horrendous cultural custom leaving girls physically and emotionally wounded). Please pray that God will intervene, and these girls will receive the care and protection they need.
- Pastor Paul in northern Uganda oversees hundreds of churches in northern Uganda and South Sudan. When lockdown occurred, he encouraged all church leaders to move people to small groups, and the ministry leaders have been visiting these groups and encouraging them.
- A similar strategy has been used by **Pastor Onesmus in southern Kenya** who gave testimony that "the church is fully alive and kicking well even when at home. This enabled many families to reunite and a lot was restored. We noticed that people are giving more than ever. Surely the church belongs to JESUS. The gates of hell will never overcome it. Thanks to God. Shalom!"

At the same time, economic and spiritual pressures upon pastors are intense. Pastor Samuel in Togo told me, "People in my country expected pastors are going to starve, but the Lord provides our needs every day. "When I offer financial assistance to Samuel, rather than keeping it for himself, he uses it to bless 15 other struggling ministry leaders in his community. This same story is echoed by **Pastor James in Tanzania**, who uses funds to help pastors plant maize which grows guickly and can be harvested to feed families. **Pastor Daniel in Tanzania** expressed that the although there is a struggle to get items they need due to lack of funds, yet "I will continue to thank God for his
