Although the journey was a bit challenging (airlines lost my bag on way to Uganda AND on way home, 9 hr. bus rides in overcrowded, filthy busses, some nights with only 1-4 hrs. sleep), but all was well worth it as God

worked in exciting ways. By God's grace, following a message in a village church with several guests from a local refugee camp, 18 people (adults and children) placed their faith in Jesus Christ. After this, we went to a nearby river (yes, the muddy crocodile river, for
