


Dear family and friends,

and I was **invited to be a part of this team** until we return to Africa. They focus in two desperately needed and significant areas:

- 1. Offering <u>biblical training to national pastors globally</u> in countries where there is the greatest need (Africa, India, SE Asia, et al).
- 2. <u>Equipping and mobilizing US pastors</u> to partner with and train communities of national pastors overseas so that this equipping ministry can multiply globally. Please let me know if <u>your pastor</u> might be interested in hearing more.





The day after Thanksgiving I will be traveling to East Africa again for nearly **four weeks to train pastors** in Uganda, Tanzania and possibly Kenya. This will be my longest trip away from the family, but Holly's parents will come to help for a good portion of that time. Life lessons from our loving God

While God has us in America, I'm trying to keep my **ears open** for what His "gentle whisper" is teaching me. Here are a couple "growth edges" I'm grappling with:

- 1. Trust God by **submitting my plans** and agenda and dreams to follow His. I am just a small part of God's wondrous masterpiece, and He can use us however He pleases. (Is.64:8; Rom.9:21)
- 2. As important and exciting as the work of training Africans is, I must **prioritize ministry to my family.** I am the only husband and father my family has. This happens as I am sensitive to and affirm the **feelings and needs of others**, to what they are saying and not saying. When I do this, the long-term benefit is even more significant than I can imagine. For example, pastors in Africa regularly ignore and neglect their family's needs. Now they are watching my example and are asking questions about how they should be loving their wives. (Matt.19:6; Eph.5:25ff, 1 Cor.7:33)

We are sincerely asking you to join us in prayer for **how soon to return to Africa**. Our hearts are there, but rushing back in our time instead of God's time will be neither wise nor honoring to Him. Please **pray for complete healing for Holly** so we can re-engage at 100%.
